

Former Students, Staff Reflect on Mr. Knight's 30 Years of Teaching at JVC



This year, Mr. Mark Knight has reached the remarkable milestone of teaching at our school for thirty years. He began his JVC teaching and coaching career in 1989. Besides five years in the late nineties when he taught elsewhere, Mr. Knight has instructed decades of JVC students. He has also been an

important part of the Vikings athletic program as an assistant coach for girls and boys basketball, track and field, and soccer.

Mr. Knight says, "A neat thing about being here for awhile has been seeing the generations go by as I coached the kids of previous students and noticed the traditions continue."

We asked some former students and staff to tell us about Mr. Knight.



How We Walked with Jesus



- Biblically Based Instruction - Each student received over 1,000 hours of academic instruction rooted in God's word.
