We find our 2023-24 theme of *Shine Like the Stars* in Daniel 12:3. It states: "And those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky above; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever." Daniel is a shining example of an individual who lived his life in such a way that his behav-

ior, attitude, and actions impacted the world for Christ. Consider these truths from the book of Daniel.

Daniel had the faith to be different than the culture. Daniel 1:8 – "But Daniel resolved that he would not defile himself."

Daniel had the faith to give all the glory to God.

Daniel 2:30 – "It is not because I am wiser than anyone else that I know the secret of your dream, but because God wants you to understand what was in your heart."
